Staff Spotlight: LaTonya Crutcher, DSP-Extraordinaire

Rauch recently nominated Direct Support Professional (DSP) LaTonya Crutcher for an Indiana Association of Rehabilitation Facilities (INARF) Keystone Award. Although she was not selected as the official award "winner", we wanted to share how much of a winner LaTonya is in our eyes with all of you.

LaTonya's first experiences supporting an individual with a disability were similar to many in her profession. She has an uncle with a disability who has always been included in the family and been supported in pursuing a full community life. LaTonya supports him in his daily living needs while maintaining a full-time job at Rauch, and their relationship has been beautifully transposed onto her interactions with all those she serves. The supports LaTonya provides are based on a foundation of mutual respect and honor.

Remarkable DSPs must utilize understanding and respect, and maintain a good Particularly among individuals with significant needs, DSP's must be knowledgeable, non-judgmental, fair, and secure. LaTonya has been just that

kind of individual in her nine years at Rauch. She comes with diverse work experiences, some involving persons with disabilities, some in service industries. Most importantly, she brings a strong work ethic, owning responsibility to know what is expected for success.

LaTonya began her career at Rauch in Supported Living, providing in-home and community supports. Her roles included home leader and serving as primary trainer for new staff. As the clientele grew, Rauch needed to monitor health aspects for clients (now termed Wellness Coordination) and LaTonya was placed in charge of all clients' medical concerns. She was responsible for contacting medical staff and ensuring all medication was on hand and given as prescribed.

A definition of keystone is "a central, cohesive source of support and stability". This embodies LaTonya's character. She EXUDES confidence – but not arrogance or superiority. She bestows this confidence upon individuals she supports, in relationships with their families, and amongst her coworkers. We have all experienced the feeling

that results from someone you respect expressing confidence in you and what you can accomplish. This is what is seen every day in every encounter with every client when LaTonya is working.



LaTonya is a natural born leader. She has a terrific way of motivating and inspiring others with humor and authenticity. Everyone knows where they stand with LaTonya and wants to be on her team. She "keeps it real" and isn't "touchy feely", but her heart of gold is always apparent. We are so grateful to have her as a driving force on our staff.



Interpreting Success

"Tax time" is trying for many Americans. However, imagine how you would be impacted if you had a language barrier that caused even greater difficulty in understanding the many nuances of the tax return preparation process.

Last year, a local couple, both of whom are deaf, visited a tax preparation company seeking their expertise. The couple are only able to communicate through American Sign Language, and cannot read lips. The husband conveyed that they

needed an interpreter, but the company denied his request. They left the establishment, returning days later with an interpreter that they paid themselves.

This year, the same couple came to Rauch Interpreting Services first, because they felt an interpreter should have been provided. The couple met with Rauch's Deaf Case Manager, Darin Souder, to discuss this issue and possible options. Darin contacted the company and spoke to the manager. The manager said they do not provide interpreters to deaf people wanting to file their taxes. Darin politely explained that under the Americans with Disabilities Law of 1990 (ADA), their business must provide communication access to their clients. The manager still refused and hung up the phone.

Next, Darin consulted a copy of the ADA regulations. Together with Dave Calvert, Director of Interpreting Services, they checked under accommodations and confirmed what Darin had told the manager. With the couple still in his office, Darin contacted a lawyer in Indianapolis who was willing to send a polite notice to the tax preparation company on their behalf. Within a week, Rauch Interpreting Services received a call from the company requesting a certified interpreter for the couple.

Because the couple refused to pay for an interpreter again and sought out Rauch Interpreting Services to assist, they were able to resolve their dispute. Many businesses simply aren't aware of the law and their obligation to provide accommodations. The more we can educate the general public, the more we will see these types of barriers disappear in the future and enjoy a more inclusive community for all.
